When wailing sirens cease, a voice cries out from Bethlehem - Hear Angels Cry

Setting aside the traditional festive decorations and Christmas tree lighting, the Bethlehem Municipality has chosen to cancel Christmas festivities due to thousands killed and instead pray for peace. Amidst the rubble and ruins, a poignant voice rises to declare that the light of hope will persist in the small West Bank town where the Christmas story unfolded.

Youstina Safar, who lives in Bethlehem and is a student at Bethlehem University, has collaborated with the London-based band *Ooberfuse* - to deliver a powerful message through a Christmas song: 'Hear Angels Cry'. The song resonates with the belief that hope for a better future will be born in the hearts of humanity, remaining resilient in the face of aggression.
